Order your trees today for spring delivery and planting.**

In addition to beautifying your property, stopping shoreline erosion, and creating habitat for wildlife, planting trees helps with the greening of the Dog and Cranberry Lakes area and contributes to cleaner air and better soil.

This year we are pleased to offer our DCLA members shrubs, deciduous, and coniferous trees for \$3 per 1 ft. tall sapling.

This year there is no upper limit on the number of trees you can order but there is
**a minimum order of 10 seedlings per species.

Shrubs:

High Bush Cranberry
Nannyberry
Black Elderberry
Red-osier dogwood

Deciduous Trees:

Tamarack
Red Oak
Sugar Maple
White Birch

Coniferous Trees:

White Cedar
White Pine

A page with detailed species descriptions is on the DCLA website, to help you make your selections.

Please keep in mind that with all seedlings there is an average of 50% that will flourish depending on the level of watering and care provided.
